When the original An Tir Domesday Boke was done, the copies and proofs were moved with Greyhounds. Okay - the buses not the dogs, but still a far cry from the second Domesday Boke which used webpages and digital photos of proofs to keep things in line and in contact.

Odd thing was, both Bokes took about the same about of time to do...

However, strolls down merchant's lane in the bigger events over the years certainly show how modern technology has become ensconced in our daily medievelism. Ten years ago it was cash - perhaps coin only for those



who changed their bills - and rare was the sight of welcomes for "Master Card" and "Lady Visa". Now most merchants not only take credit cards but many have uplinks to record the transactions live.

Gone are the nights of lying in the field at Pennsic trying to upload the day's transactions in bulk, or standing by a pay phone reading off the receipts to the bank. We are the very image of modern medievalist.

We bring our cell phones, our laptops and our generators. Some of these are creature comforts and some are welcome safety nets. We have Personal Digital Assistants containing the Order of Precedence for processions and containing ceremonials for court. We use walkie talkies instead of heralds and golf carts instead of feet. We have laser levels instead of water levels and sunglasses instead of hats.

Most of these are darn handy, if not essential to the survival of "Bob" as he jumps from the comforts of the 21st century into the excitement of pre-1700, but as we embrace each of these technologies we should keep in mind which are truly essential and which are really just merely handy.

Directions

From the West: Follow Highway 3 toward the Okanagan. Just over 24 kilometers (15 miles) East of Hedley, you will pass a pull-off, then Cawston Tire. Directly after that, make a sharp right as indicated by a large sign for Cathedral Lake and Ashnola Campgrounds. This will lead you over the Historic Red Bridge. You are now on the Ashnola Road heading West.

From the North and East: Make your best way to Keremeos. Follow Highway 3 Westbound for 4.5 kilometers (2.8 miles) West of Keremeos and turn left as indicated by a large sign for Cathedral Lake and Ashnola Campgrounds. This will lead you over the Historic Red Bridge. You are now on the Ashnola Road heading West.

From the South: Make your best way to Osoyoos, the first town North of the USA/Canada border. Turn West (left) onto Highway 3 and travel to Keremeos. Travel 4.5 kilometers (2.8 miles) West of Keremeos and turn left as indicated by a large sign for Cathedral Lake and Ashnola Campground. This

will lead you over the Historic Red Bridge. You are now on the Ashnola Road heading West.

Once across the bridge: Follow Ashnola Road for 8.5 kilometers (5.3 miles) through farmlands until it curves South into the Ashnola Valley. The Ashnola Campgrounds will be on your right-hand side. Proceed to the gate just inside the fence. Parking for those towing trailers is available along the fence line and other vehicles can be parked across the road in the grassy field.


