Lion of An Tir, Knight, Pelican awards too many to list. His brutal honesty was legendary as was his taste in colourful gambesons. My first contact with Barak was at my second event, September Crown 1987, where he won his first Silver Rose, he was King when I went to Estella (there are many stories there, many I cannot share here), he was Kingdom Earl Marshal when I became Northern Regional Marshal. One of my favourite memories though is of him with tears of laughter streaming from his eyes after his opponent had just struck himself in the cup and fallen dead. Barak insisted they



continue the fight but it was awhile before he could stop laughing long enough to begin.

Rest in peace my brother, you will be missed.

Caitrin and I would like to take this time to wish you all a very happy Christmas season. With a new Prince and Princess on the Storm Thrones we anticipate a full and exciting year to come. We also look forward to our Baronial Yule Banquet. With the change of date for this event we will have a little more seasonal festiveness at this gathering. Hope to see many of you there.

I've had a couple of people approach me about the job (YAY) so I thought, in the interest of, well, interest, I'd publish here what the job generally entails.

General Requirements

- A Greater Officer of the Barony must have a valid SCA membership in order to be Warranted (where the Crown grants authority to do the job)
- Officers serve a two year term but if you need to step down before then, by all means, start the process.
- Attend the monthly Baronial Council meetings to provide a report (make an effort to get to most of em at least)
- If you can't attend, send a written report to the Seneshal and Baronial Coronet before

the meeting or send your deputy, if you have one.

- Responsible for two lesser offices -Webminister and Library. These offices report to you. You report to Council.
- Must publish 10 issues of the North Wind each year (double issues for Jul-Aug and Dec-Jan). If you wanted to, you could have a deputy that does this and you just approve it.
- Must send Quarterly reports to the Principality Chronicler (or just ensure they get a monthly copy of the North Wind)
- Must have the software required to do the job (min MS Word). Ability to produce pdf file is a major bonus as that the distribution format of the newsletter.

- Must be aware of and abide by copyright laws. This is very important and applies to the website too.
- The Kingdom Chronicler's Handbook clearly defines what you can and cannot do. Honour, chivalry and common sense will serve you well. And if you're unsure about something, there's always tons of resources to draw from.

Other stuff

- At Council meetings, take meeting notes/minutes. Some officers send you their reports for inclusion of the notes/minutes which is nice. If you don't want to do this, feel free to reinstate the Lesser Office of Baronial Secretary which is a right of your Office.
- If you want to take a deputy or fill a lesser office, you don't necessarily need Council approval but they should be informed. It's important to keep the Seneschal and the Baronial Coronet happy!
- The North Wind must be published / released within a week of the Baronial Council meeting.

- When you take the Office, you swear an oath of fealty to the Barony and/or Coronet.
- Ever need help? There is a lot to be found. The handbook, the Seneschal, past Chroniclers, Principality and Kingdom Chroniclers, the Chronicler Yahoo Group, any deputies you might have - all good sources of info and assistance.

For me, I generally spend about 8-14 hours cranking out an edition of the North Wind and about 10 mins to an hour doing Council notes (after the meeting). Other little bits just kind of happen and I deal with them immediately so they don't take up too much time (which is very infrequent).

From the Baronial Archer

Royal Rounds in December used to be something Lions Gate Archers could only dream about. Cold, wet and miserable weather seldom encourages anyone to make a trip out to the archery range. But now our archers will have a chance to hone their skills and submit Royal Round scores.

Once a month, the Barony will be hosting a Special Archery Practice at the Cloverdale Agriplex that will give us a full 40-yard range. The schedule for these Special Archery Practices are:

> December 8 January 19 February 16 March 23

Our first Special Archery Practice in November had 14 archers out shooting. This is good but we can do better. If we want to keep our practice fee at \$3, we will need to see more archers coming out. We need 30 archers to make it out each night to cover the rental.

Impossible? No, it is not. There are more than 30 archers in the Barony. We just need you to come out. We need you to bring your friends. Never shot before? Come on out and we will coach you.

Interested in making the Lions Gate Company of Archers? You could have all your Royal Round Averages and your IKAC requirements done before the outdoor season begins.

Nowhere to shoot your crossbow? We can do crossbow here.

How about you make it a family outing? In addition to the regular Royal Round range, I will also set up a children's range.

Not interested in Royals? I am sure we can arrange for a game of Hoyles, a wand shoot, or set up some oversized stuffed teddy bears.

Cloverdale isn't really all that hard to find and neither is the site. From Highway #1, from East or West - take the 176th Street/Cloverdale exit to Cloverdale. Or take Highway #10 which runs right through Cloverdale and turn on to 176th Street. Border crossings: again, follow the signs to Cloverdale - the truck crossing is 176th Street on the Canadian side of the border, the Peace Arch crossing will lead you to Hwy #10.

Once you are on 176th in Cloverdale, the entrance to the site is located between 60th and 64th Ave at the newly installed traffic light. Turn into the entrance with the huge log arch. Can't miss it, it sticks out like a sore thumb but it may be difficult to see at night. The Agriplex is straight down the little road. Big building. You can't miss it. There is *tons* of parking.

So wax your bows, sharpen your points, and plan out your carpools. See you there! *

 To create and maintain a web forum where people can post looking for rides, or advertise that they have space in their vehicles, while maintaining a phone messaging system for those who don't have access to internet;


- Wildly promote the Dragonward program at events, practices, and through frequent rider/driver initiatives;

Archers of the Mary Rose

It is thought that the number of men on the Mary Rose when she sank numbered between 500 and 700. To estimate those who would be archers we could look at the number of bows (which was 250) but that number is questionable as it is the duty of archers to supply their own bows. As well, bows were recovered still in crates therefore not issued.

Of the bodies thought to be archers the following was discovered:

- thickened left forearms,
- spinal deformations,
- changes to shoulder blades, possibly from of heavy bows,
- ages in their early 20's,
- large men, roughly 6 feet tall, and
- massively boned.

When comparing bow sizes to archer's height, a bow between 6 and 7 feet matches archers 5'7 to 6'.

During the battle in 1545 Henry's plan was not to engage the French fleet who outnumbered him 225 ships to 60. He wanted to draw them in and use shore batteries. So, what was the function of the archers on the Mary Rose?

Books suggest:

- Sharpshooters, range finders, and to battle ashore.

Other options:

- Flaming arrows (two heavy leather mitts were found)
- Ship defence, if the battled soured

Archer's Clothing

<u>Jack</u>

A Jack is a stiff leather sleeveless jerkin, possibly capable of giving some protection against slashing cuts, glancing arrows or shrapnel. One was found near an archer and is presumed to be his. These 12 jerkins were oak-tanned calf skin.

Bracers

Twelve bracers have been recovered from the site. Eleven are leather and one is bone. Three of the leather bracers were embossed with the Royal arms, the Tudor Rose and Castle as well as the pomegranate for Catherine of Aragon. The ivory bracer survived by being buried under a coil of tarred rope.

Arrow Clips

Arrows were found either tied in bundles of 24 or in arrow clips. Each clip would have 24 holes, each a ½ inch in diameter. The clips have stitch marks suggesting a cloth bag would have been sewn to the clip to cover the arrows.

Mary Rose Bows

Henry VIII had intended on maintaining archery as part of his war arsenal. He had ordered 40,000 staves from Venice and had passed a number of laws requiring all male citizens to practice. There was also strict rules to the quality of equipment produced by both bow and arrow makers.

The Anthony Roll listed 250 bows of yew on the Mary Rose.

Archaeological evidence has produced the following evidence:

- 167 yew self bows recovered.
- All bows constructed with heartwood and sapwood.
- Bow length 1.80 2.06 meter (6' 1 1/2" - 6' 11") average 6' 6".
- Bow weight 80 180 lbs with most in the 100-120 range.
- Suggested evidence of horn nocks (discoloration of the ends).
- No evidence of hand grips. (There was evidence of feathers through glue marks and the discoloration of wood).
- 80% of the bows are marked with stamp marks.
- Bows had either knots removed or areas around knots raised.





- Most bows slightly reflexed. This could be from the drying rates of the heart and sap wood, or from steaming.
- Some bows were "whipped", reducing the limb before the horn nocks to increase limb speed.
- None of the bows showed arrow rub.
- Some bows had been strung when the ship sank (bow set).

We have looked at facts. Now let's look at some possibilities.

Henry VIII had ordered that all men of capable

age would shoot longbows and that fathers were responsible in providing bows for their sons. The Anthony Roll lists 250 bows on board and none of the recovered bows show any sign of usage.

- Had the archers brought their own bows on board?
- The bows that had been strung were issued but never fired?
- The bows that had been whipped were modified before battle but never fired?
- Although bowyers were ordered to make 4 other bows to every yew bow, why were only yew bows found?
- Is there a possibility of a small leather wrap where the arrows would rest as no arrow rub had been noted?

Mary Rose Arrows

The arrows found on the Mary Rose represent the only certifiable English medieval arrows existing today. Since 1979, over 2000 arrows have been recovered (poplar, beech, ash, and hazel). The Anthony Roll listed the ship as carrying 400 sheaves (9600 arrows) and 6 gross of bowstrings (864).

With marine micro-organisms being very partial to horn, none of the bone inserts survived.

However, by looking at the glue stains for the feathers, the depth of the slot for the horn insert, and the slot width we can learn many things.

Arrow length

The majority of the arrows on the Mary Rose were between 30 and 31.5 inches. With a bodkin point added on these arrows would have drawn between 28 and 29 inches comfortably. A percentage of the arrows were shorter (as short as 27 inches). As this would have been a shooting hazard they would have to have been

used for special circumstances.

Arrow diameter

The majority of the Mary Rose arrows were ½ diameter shafts. They were tapered to 3/8ths at the feathers (bobtailed). This tapering would have made for better arrow clearance.

Reinforced nocks

The nock end of the arrow was tapered to 3/8th (still larger than our largest SCA target arrow) and had been reinforced with 2 inches of bone. The string slot was 1/8th of an inch. This would leave 1/8th of an inch on either side.

Feathers

All the feathers on the Mary Rose arrows had been eaten away. Traces suggest the feathers were either goose or more likely swan. Fortunately the glue and string wrappings stained the shafts leaving us with some clues. The feathers were approximately 7.5 inches and were definitely tied on.

It is hoped as the years of study on the Mary Rose and her 18,000 artefacts increase some of the questions regarding the reign of Henry VIII and the English Navy will become clearer.*
