# the baron's column

*Baron Griffin ap Bedwyr*

There has been some discussion lately about a study group for people interested in applying for the Sergeantry. If you have an interest in this it is probably a good idea to start working on it as soon as possible. I certainly encourage anyone to make the effort and take on this challenge. It is not easy though, nor should it be, so the more time devoted to studying all the aspects the better. The testing weekend can be very stressful and busy and if you are not prepared things can go south pretty quick.

I am a big fan of the Sergeantry (now when my lady and I talk about the Sergeantry that includes all disciplines, Sergeant, Yeoman, Gallant, and Courtier); of course I am biased as I am not only the Baron but also a former Sergeant. The reason for the Sergeantry has evolved over the years but I still think it serves a purpose. Ask anyone who has gone through the testing and whether they passed or not they got something out of it. You maybe be doing it for the challenge, to prove something to yourself, to find a place, or maybe your goal is to serve the Baroness the best way you can. When I was a Sergeant there were many who came from far and wide just to be able to serve Baroness Amanda, some even from out of Kingdom. So if you are leaning towards applying start to put some serious thought to it, start your studying now.

Another thought I wanted to put into peoples heads is loaner gear. The other night at fighter/archery practice we had several people who were eager to

learn and get involved but do not yet have their own gear. We have what is called a Iron Key which like Goldkey for garb is loaner gear for fighters, both heavy and rapier. As far as I know the rapier gear is pretty good though they could always use more, for heavy we only have enough to outfit one fighter. We also are a little short when it comes to archery loaner gear. So to that end I would like to encourage the citizens of the Barony to consider donating equipment to these loaner piles so we can have more individuals involved in these activities. If you have items to donate you can contact the Master of Stables Cyneric Bearson for Iron Key, for archery officer James Wolfden, and for Steel Key (rapier) Warrick Drakkar. Now remember it doesn't have to be high quality or pretty, just functional. Actually we find that the prettier the stuff is the less likely people are to get their own stuff.

### Some Definitions of Adult Support Persons

**Kingdom Preceptor:** keeps Pages transcripts, receives all reports

**Provost of Pages at Principality Level:** Regional Administrator, reports to Kingdom

**Dean of Pages (at branch level):** reports to Principality

**Sponsor:** an experienced SCA Member providing moral support, ideas, interest to help the Page achieve their goals. College of Pages Officers and Deputies can be Sponsors if it would create a hardship to find outside adults. A Peer or experienced SCA member accepts a youth in sponsorship that is separate from any oath of fealty, should be of a year's duration, and is renewable as decided between all participants. The College can assist an initiate Page in locating a Sponsor with appropriate interests.

**Teachers, Mentors and Volunteers** work with the pages on specific classes, service areas and projects in time limited ways to help them achieve their goals. This is a great way for parents to share in the youth activities, learning and teaching alongside their offspring.

**Officers at Branch and Principality Level** can help us by thinking of services young people 12 - 17 years of age can provide your office at events. This year they are just starting out, but by next year they will be able to provide quite sophisticated levels of service, as you will see by the Challenge levels which will be provided to you.

From time to time we will be advertising for Mentors to meet the interests of young gentles who want to do certain projects.

On the other hand if you have interests you would like to share with young people please register with the College and we will try to match you with a young person who would like to share your interests and services. You may sign up as a Sponsor, short term mentor, service supervisor or as a class teacher.

This is a grave responsibility, not to be undertaken lightly, for even as they take their place in Court and at Their Excellencies side, the Defender must know that by their deeds, they show forth the honour and chivalry of this Baronial Court, and the Barony of Lions Gate to all the Known World.

Know well that the Defenders are required, when present, to join the Baron and Baroness at Their Court; that they will represent the Barony when travelling to other lands; that they will strive to attend Baronial Banquet, Baroness' Tournament, and May Bardic of this coming year; that they will compete in the name of Lions Gate throughout the next year; and finally, that they swear fealty or an oath of service to the Barony.

Have those competitors currently holding champion or defender titles from other lands, or those planning on competing in other champion or defender tournaments within the coming year, discussed this with the Baron and Baroness?

Allow any competitors who have not discussed this to do so now.

And know too, that the Defenders of the Barony of Lions Gate will be an active and positive force in the education and proctoring of their skills within our fair Barony, as well as reaching out to travel and shine as an exemplar of skill and teaching ability to the remainder of our strong Principality of Tir Righ, the great Kingdom of An Tir, and beyond.





# TIR RIGH BARDIC CHAMPIONSHIP

## THE PRINCIPALITY OF TIR RIGH BARDIC CHAMPIONSHIP IS COMING!!!

The Principality of Tir Righ Bardic Championship will be held at the Spring Coronet Tourney in Eisenmarche, May 22-24, 2009, with Bardic competition taking place on SUNDAY May 24 (time TBA).

### PURPOSE:

The Championship is held to select the one with greatest skill, versatility, knowledge, and creativity in the performing arts. The performing arts can include Vocal music, Instrumental music, Storytelling, Poetry, Drama, Dance, Physical arts (jugglers, acrobats, jesters, magicians, etc).

- Skill will be evaluated on both technical merit and performance in front of an audience.
- Versatility will be evaluated from the number of different performing arts performed.
- Knowledge will be evaluated from documentation presented (whether written or oral).
- Creativity will be evaluated from presentation of original compositions.

### WHO MAY ENTER:

- 1) Members in good standing of the SCA.
- 2) Residents of Tir Righ for one year and intending to remain a resident for the next year. (The Coronet may grant exceptions.)
- 3) Entrants must have read, understood and agree to abide by the "Duties of a Principality Champion" as delineated in Principality Law, Article III. (see below)
- 4) Entrants must declare their intent to compete, along with what they will be entering, to Their Highnesses of Tir Righ, the Principality Minister of Arts & Sciences, and the Bardic Deputy by April 22
- 5) Entrants must present themselves before Their Highnesses for the Invocation of the Bardic Lists at Court on Saturday May 23.\
- 6) The competition will be held on SUNDAY with the new Champion being announced and invested at closing Court on Sunday.

Deadline to declare intent to compete is April 22. Please read carefully the information below and feel free to contact me for further information, pointers, advice and clarification.

### COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE TITLE OF BARDIC CHAMPION OF TIR RIGH/SKALD OF THE NORTH WILL BE AS FOLLOWS:

1. A Letter of Intent must be sent at least one month prior to competition. Letter of intent should include what pieces or research papers you will be presenting, their time period and genre (including whether they will be accompanied and on what instrument/s) so that suitable judges can be arranged ahead of time.  
*Single Entrants Only.* If one or both of your pieces is a group performance (ie: a recorder consort or madrigal group) only ONE member of the group may be competing.

2. THREE pieces must be presented for competition and judging.
  - a. Each competitor will have up to 15 minutes to present their material before the judges.
  - b. Acceptable Bardic genres may be Music (vocal or instrumental, or combinations thereof) Story-telling, Poetry, Dance, Dramatic performance, Mummery, Juggling, puppetry, or any other performance" style acceptable within the SCA.

- c. Bardic competition pieces presented should be period (between 650-1600AD) from any culture or be SCA acceptable. Points will be given for skill, versatility, knowledge, and originality.
  - Pieces also may be original compositions/performances, in a period style or SCA acceptable style.
  - You may wish to choose pieces of differing genres, in contrasting styles of the same genre, or different time periods.
- d. One of your pieces may also be presented as a Research Paper.
  - Research papers must be submitted to the Bardic Deputy one month prior to competition to allow judges time to adequately read and digest information presented prior to competitor's Q&A time. Please be sure to include proper bibliography, footnotes and citations.
- e. All pieces and papers will be presented in front of an audience of the populace, in addition to the competition judges.
  - In the case of research papers, please be prepared to offer a short explanation of the content of your paper to those assembled prior to Q&A time.
- f. Written documentation is required at the time of competition (except for research papers which will be submitted ahead of time). Please bring sufficient copies of your documentation (minimum 3 copies, 4-5 is better.) and be prepared to answer questions about your pieces and documentation from the judges and audience.
- g. If you require time to "set-up" prior to performance, please inform those who will be running the competition how much time and what you require, prior to competition time.

I am taking names for future workshops, and if you will send me an email, I will add your name to the waiting list for the next turnshoe class.

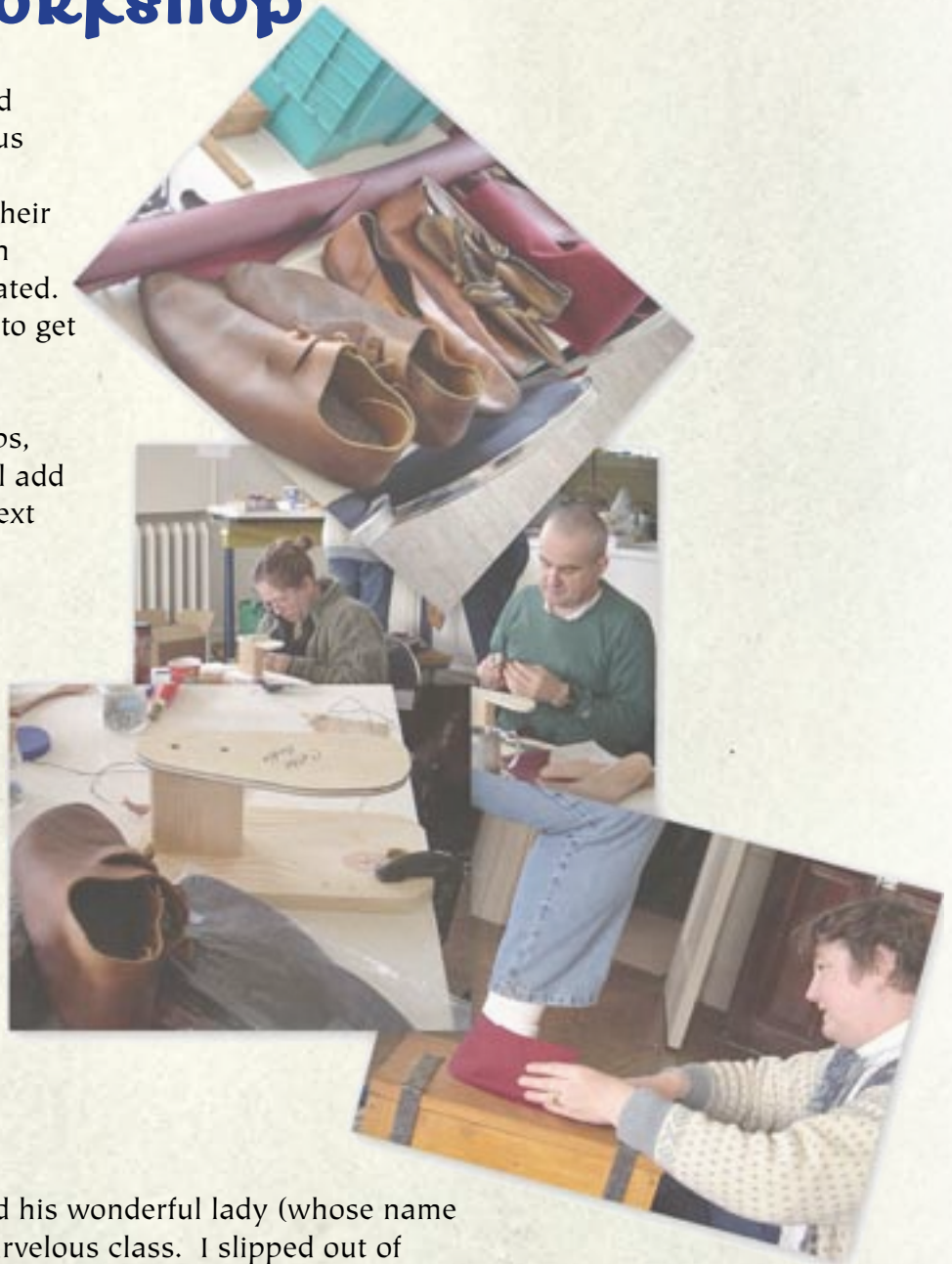
