winter tournes januars 23, 2010

The parameters for this year's Shire Bardic Championship are as follows:

- 1. Competitors must perform two selections in any two different genres: eg. vocal song and poem; instrumental song and juggling; instrumental song and vocal song, etc.
- 2. One of the selections must be from period (AD 600-1600); performance in period style is encouraged though not required.
- 3. The period piece must be accompanied by basic documentation: a short paragraph on the who-what-when-where-why-how of the piece is sufficient. Please submit one copy to Shire Bardic Champion prior to the championship.
- 4. The non-period piece may be entirely modern, but original work and SCA-friendly selections are both strongly encouraged.
- 5. Each competitor must speak to the Shire Bardic Champion briefly earlier in the day to register for the competition. This is a good chance to submit your documentation as well.

MASTER OF BLADES

Greetings all,

Well it's been over 3 years since I accepted the role of Master of Blades for Lions Gate. It's been a lot of fun. We've grown our practice and our fighters in that time and made the practice profitable. We've built our Steel Key up to 5 steel swords, 6 masks, gloves, back of the head, daggers, batons, bucklers and more. We learned some things, we broke some things, we made some great discoveries in realms of chicken wings, birthday bear pits, and plasterons.

I had a great time as MOB. Thank you all for making this job such a joy. It's time to step aside and allow someone else to step up.

The Master of Blades is a deputy position to the Master of Stables and is a 2 year term.

Your duties & qualifications are:

- to manage the rapier practice for Lions Gate, ensuring that rapier combat occurs safely within the Branch.
- required to be a Junior Marshal at time of application, but must attain your Senior Marshal

authorization within 2 months of accepting this position.

- to assist in the authorization of new fighters.
- to report monthly & quarterly to either the Master of Stables OR directly to Council. Quarterly reports are also required by you to the Principality Rapier Marshal.
- to ensure that waivers are signed at each practice and that dues collected from the rapier practice are received by the Baronial Exchequer on a regular basis.
- while you are not required to *be* the MIC for Baronial rapier tourneys and/or war scenarios, you should work with event autocrats to ensure that a qualified Senior Marshal has committed to set-up and run the tourney and/or war scenarios. You will also step up and Marshal, when needed.

Additional assets we are looking for are:

- -comfortable speaking in front of groups and teaching classes, as well as individuals.
- -the ability to problem solve and resolve conflicts.

12th night scrou/charter contest

Treetings scribes,

This year at 12th Night there will be a Kingdom Scroll contest AND a Painted Charter contest for charters for Owain and Wrenn's upcoming Reign.

Categories for the Painted Charter Contest are "KING'S FAVORITE" and "QUEEN'S FAVORITE"

Eligible Charters are those completed and turned in Saturday of Twelfth Night. Scribes wishing to enter the contest must lightly put on the back of the charter in PENCIL their name, branch, and contact info. There is a room in the convention center that will be set aside for scribal activities where painting can occur. Charters painted prior to 12th Night are also eligible.

Categories for the An Tir 12th Night Scroll contest:

NOVICE SCRIBE

One of the scribe's first five original SCA scrolls; scroll submitted must be for Kingdom level award

BEST MEDIEVAL CALLIGRAPHY

Must provide a readable copy of the medieval manuscript/document exemplar used.

BEST USE OF HERALDRY

Includes the achievement with documented armory and the use of documented badges, etc. as appropriate.

BEST EARLY ILLUMINATION STYLE SCROLL

Styles prior to 1200

BEST LATER ILLUMINATION STYLE SCROLL

Styles after 1200 (scrolls 1150--1225 should put a date on their scroll to help with judging)

POPULACE CHOICE

Populace choice is decided by anyone who wishes to cast a ballot.

CONTESTANTS' CHOICE

Scribes who have entered get to pick the one they like best

JUDGE'S & STAFF'S FAVORITE

Scrolls eligible for the contest must be for previously bestowed An Tir Kingdom level awards (those to be awarded at 12th Night are not eligible to avoid court confusion) or armigerous awards from her Principalities completed within the last two years which have not previously been entered into a Kingdom level contest. If a small number of scrolls are entered, sponsor reserves the right to remove some categories from the contest.

Bring entries to scribal room in Convention Center where they will be displayed.

This year's competition has two parts:

FIRST

One entry - art or science worth a possible 100 points. (judging forms to be 60% based on art and 40% based on documentation)

SECOND

An additional page of documentation on the submitter's persona and how the entry relates to such. Worth a possible 30 points.

JUDGING CRITERIA FOR THE FIRST ENTRY

1. ART (total 60 points)

A. Visual (10 points)

- Initial impression 1-5 points
- Display 1-5 points

B. Authenticity of design and process (25 points)

- Final piece looks historically accurate 1-5 points
- Design of object makes use of period styles, cuts, shapes, silhouettes, space 1-5 points
- Period methods used in creating the piece
 1-5 points
- Period materials used in creating the piece
 1-5 points
- Processes used were appropriate to the final piece. 1-5 points

C. Technical Ability (10 points)

- Overall finished quality of the piece, entrant demonstrated a mastery of techniques, materials, execution. 1-10 points
- Complexity of the piece, 15 points

- Process involved in creating the piece was time consuming 1-5 points
- A large amount of skill was used to create the piece 1-5 points
- Many different techniques and/or working with numerous elements were required.
 1-5 points

2. DOCUMENTATION

A. Oral presentation (15 points)

- Entry presented in a clear and organized manner 1-5 points
- Depth of knowledge displayed during presentation 1-5 points
- Ability to field questions. 1-5 points

B. Documentation (25 points)

- Description of where and when the entry would be from. 1-5 points
- Process used in the interpretation and creation of the piece and suitable rationales for departure from period. 1-5 points
- Quality of sources used. 1-5 points
- Organization of documentation. 1-5 points
- Topic was hard to research. 1-5 points

JUDGING CRITERIA FOR THE SECOND ENTRY

- A. Persona documentation 15 points
- B. A&S entry and it's relation to your persona 15 points.
