Ask Doctor Carus

Dear Dr. Carus:

The other day I was washing my favourite silver spoon, when I noticed the silver chipping off. "Egads," I cried, "it's plated!" Imagine my dismay in realizing my treasured family heirloom was a fake. When did they start making silver plated items, and were they more prevalent or popular than solid silver? Bonus question: Was there any social stigma surrounding having plate versus

the solid stuff? Sincerely, Penny Cuillère

My Lady Cuillère,

Last issue, I discussed just what makes gold so great. That was the Sweat of the Sun; now for the Tears of the Moon. Silver (= Argentum, "shiny"; symbol Ag) is also classed as "noble", since it too is found as native nuggets. However, the metal is also refined from various silver ores – that often occur with lead ones, making lead metal a waste byproduct of the silver industry, which is why it's classically been so cheap. Silver will also slowly react with air – the resulting thin film or "tarnish" of surface oxide protects the underlying metal from further corrosion, like the patina of copper alloys but unlike the flaking rust of iron; traces of hydrogen sulfide, such as from flatulence and rotten eggs, turns this to darker Ag₂S.

Though silver is thus not as "immortal" as gold, still it too can be readily beaten into foil, drawn into wire, cast into ingots, or stamped with the image of Caesar. And it has one trick that gold has not: it's poison. Not that you and I would notice (except to permanently turn blue, were we to ingest enough of its dust or salts – called "argyria"), but enough slowly leaches from a surface to kill any nearby poor bacteria, who lack the heavy-metal flushing machinery of we multicellulars. Hence, less disease from improperly-washed plates and utensils if they're actual "silverware", or from river-water in silver ewers (Herodotus *The Histories*, 5th C. BC, Book 1, s. 188); hence, physicians applying silver-impregnated ointments and plasters to wounds against infection (Pliny *Natural History*, 1st C. AD, Book 33 Ch. 35); hence, a reputation amongst the Folk as an apotropaic against other "demonic" phenomena (e.g. Evil-infused sorcerers, vampires & werewolves).

For this purpose then, there need only be silver at the surface. Gluing leaf on by hand was known from Antiquity, and long did Alchemy do "silvering" of base metal objects (and eventually, of glass mirrors) by applying liquid mercury-silver amalgam (such as still used in dentistry) then evaporating the mercury in hot oil (Al-Razi, M./Lat. Rhazes *Sirr Al-Asrar/The Secret of Secrets*, 10th C.; Biringuccio, V. *De la Pirotechnia*, 1540); while "hot-dipping" of sheet iron into molten tin to make "tinplate" dates from the 16th C. However, the first mass-produced "silver plate" (today called "Old Sheffield Plate") only appeared in 1743, by heat-fusing silver sheets to copper slabs, and rolling and forming them together into "silver" buttons etc at ¼ the price (no longer now just for those proverbially born with silver spoons in their mouths! *Deb. Proc. Congress U.S.*, 1801); wares in this material became more socially acceptable (i.e. less seen as attempts at affectation, or counterfeit) after the English Parliament in 1784 allowed the maker to add a Maker's Mark, as was previously only used to certify items as solid silver (or rather, "Sterling", a standard and more durable alloy, with 7.25% copper). From about 1840, even thinner layers of silver were deposited onto copper, nickel or pewter objects by "electroplating".

All such "silver plate" can be distinguished in that the Real Thing should bear "Sterling", "925", or some other Hallmark on top of the Maker's Mark; or, if you don't trust that, by density (copper & nickel ca. 8.9 g/mL, silver 10.5 g/mL), or by the look of a discrete scratch, epecially after touched with nitric acid; also, silver is the most thermally conductive of all metals, and a solid piece briefly touched to the inside of the experienced wrist will feel colder than if it was mostly something else. "Poor man's silver" in Period included pewter (an alloy mostly of tin, and sometimes in those days, some lead – ick!), and iron or mild steel; today, it's aluminum, nickel-copper ("melchior"), and stainless steel.

Any pits and scratches through the silver layer will quickly spread as the underlying base metal acts as a sacrificial anode ("red plague", if copper). You can prolong the life of your silver plate (typically, 30 years of heavy use) by prompt and brief washing, then storing dry (a bit of camphor nearby scavenges any trace of nasty sulphurous vapours); and re-brightening, not through polishing off any tarnish, but by reversing the corrosion reaction through contact with aluminum foil in baking soda and water (http://scifun.chem.wisc.edu/homeexpts/TARNISH.html – not quite Period, but neither, I'm afraid, is your heirloom). Eventually, when the silver layer finally wears through (as yours has, my poor Lady!), it can still be replated – consult your local Silverware Outlet.

Looking Good In Black!

The Barony is back in black once again thanks to the quick actions of the Baronial Financial Committee and some successful events.

Anika reported that the bank balance as of August 26th was over \$10,000 again. More importantly, the expenses for the year were estimated at \$3700 and the float and gate from SYGC was still to be deposited.

The success of the Tournament of Armies with the increased practise fees and cost cutting helped turn things around.

We still need to watch our spending as some costs are continuing to rise. The HST will added an extra \$180 to the cost of the locker rental for next year. The income statement for April – June is included below.
