
Aibinn and Caoimhe both received Silver Pillars for the service they have done to the Principality.

The Order of Valiance



Recently, Society has approved the Fourth Order of Peerage, The Order of Defense. This new order recognizes excellence and Peer Like Qualities in the Rapier and Cut and Thrust Martial Activities.

A proposal has recently been submitted to the SCA Board of Directors to be discussed at the April 18th Board meeting for a Fifth Order of Peerage, The Order of Valiance, an omnibus peerage to handle all martial activities not already covered by the Order of Chivalry and the new Order of Defense.

The proposal was drafted from the input from over 850 people from across the Known World. All Kingdoms had representation including the soon to be Kingdom of Avacal.

The key proposal is to have a peerage that will not only handle existing Martial activities like archery, siege weapons, thrown weapons, and equestrian but to have a peerage that can handle future martial activities.

The Census done in 2010 indicated that 22% of people that indicated they stopped participating in the SCA did so because they felt they were not appreciated. It is hoped that by adding an omnibus martial peerage we will a means of recognizing our members and thus encouraging them to keep playing.

Target archery already has a wide participation with numbers rivaling that heavy armoured combat and target archery (with trickle-downs to combat archery) is growing in popularity through popular media including The Hunger Games and The Arrow. The SCA is natural place for many of the people interested in these shows to learn more about archery. Retaining these people will not solely depend on recognition but it is a big factor.
