April 25, 2007

- May Bardic and Defenders (James Wolfden): We're looking pretty good for profit with 70-80 members in attendance. Finances aren't finalized yet. Rough guess is \$500 in profit because the site expense was much lower

**Growing Herbs - The Basics**

Perhaps you'd like to use fresh herbs in your cooking or you enjoyed the fragrance of the herbs as you brushed past them in a museum garden. Whatever the reason, the idea has taken root and you're ready to start. If you knew where to start.

First consider the space you have available for the garden. How much sunlight does it receive? Does it get direct sun all day, part of the day or is it in shade? Most herbs prefer full sun, needing at least 4-6 hours of direct sun a day, although there are a few that will tolerate shade.

What type of soil is in the garden - clay and silt , sand or loam? Clay and silt soils have very small particles and slick and sticky when wet. They hold water well, sometimes too well, but water runs off quickly when the surface is dry. Sandy soil contain large particles and does not compact well when squeezed in your fist. This soil type is usually light colored and does not retain water well. Loam is a combination of the first two soil types and organic matter. Moist loam will form a ball when squeezed in your fist and the ball crumbles when poked. It absorbs and holds water well. Most soils can be amended by the addition of organic matter to make it more productive and balance the sand/clay ratios.

Does water stand in the space you've selected or does it stream through the area after a heavy rain? If so, look for another area. Your plants won't appreciate being drowned or swept away. Consider raised beds to improve drainage.

Do a little research on the herbs you would like to grow. Some plants take more water than others and some will tolerate shade better. Groups your herbs by their light, water and soil needs. Some don't take well to heat and need to be started early in the season. Most herbs can be sown directly in the garden, while others will be most successful if bought as seedlings or cuttings and transplanted into the garden.

If you buy a packet of seeds, be sure the seeds are fresh. Results will be much better with seeds that haven't been on the shelf for years. Check the packet for the date. Seedlings should be from a nearby nursery or gardening department. The microclimate from a nearby source will more closely match that of your garden than one located across town. Look for healthy plants with a good color. Tall, spindly plants are not better than short, bushy plants.

Don't crowd your plants. The seed packet or information marker with your seedling will list the space the plant needs. Heed their advice and give you herb room to grow.

Herbs, like all plants, like fertilizer. The herbs will grow bigger and greener if fertilized. Fertilized herbs tend to have less essential oils than their unfertilized counterparts. Less essential oil equals less flavor and aroma. The choice is up to the gardener.

Mulch your herb beds with 1-3 inches of a hardwood mulch or hardwood and sawdust mix. Mulch conserves water and cuts down on weeds. It also helps control the spread of invasive herbs, such as mint. The time you spend in mulching will be repaid in the time you don't have to spend in watering and weeding.

Herbs are generally quite hardy and resistant to insects and diseases. If you plan to use your herbs in cooking, do not use synthetic

pesticides on them. Insecticidal soap or horticultural oil can control severe outbreaks of aphids and mites. Planting a variety of herbs generally helps attract helpful insects to keep the harmful ones in check.

If you have questions or problems, many resources are available. Your local county extension service offers many types of assistance, from lists of the best varieties of each herb for the area to free or low cost soil tests to free classes. Many of the gardening clubs offer help to gardeners. You might ask a member of your local herbalist guild.
